Student's should wear their Ecole uniform, have their hair in two low pigtails. Please bring all shoes if they do two or more classes, eg. Ballet and Jazz.

Students will be given their costume at the end of the Rehearsal. Please ensure your Term 4 invoice has been paid for your child to receive their costume.

What to bring and wear



- Students arrive in their concert costume, including their tights and/or socks and their dance shoes
- If you think your child will require a snack, please only pack a very small, healthy snack eg. a small sandwich, crackers, fruit or vegetable sticks. NO nuts, chocolates or lollies. Nothing sticky or messy
- Bring a water bottle
- Ensure you have some extra bobby pins packed to secure your child's headpiece
- Remember to label all personal items
- Ensure underwear cannot be seen under the costume
- Ensure your child doesn't have on any jewellery or any temporary tattoos

On the day



- If your child is ill on the day, please send a text to 0433 832 653
- Your child's regular assistant will be with their class and the teachers oversee the students. We have parent's mobile numbers and will contact you if there is an issue
- If your child is in two shows, they will go with you after Show 1 and return for Show 2 at 12.45 pm
- The show is professionally filmed and photographed. No personal photography or videography is allowed
- No parents are allowed backstage or in the dressing room
- Children are shown the stage and lights before the show, so they feel comfortable with the stage area

Costumes & Shoes



Ballet Students

Please ensure your ballet shoes are clean. Ballet shoes must be Bloch or MDM brand, canvas, with two cross elastics and no ties at the front. Ballet shoes can be washed on a cool, gentle cycle in a delicates bag and hung to dry. Ecole sells ballet shoes if you require a new pair. Please ensure your child's name is written inside their shoes.



Ballet tights

Ballet students require new/clean theatrical pink tights. You will be asked to buy new ones if your tights are discoloured. They should also have a spare pair in their bag. If we have to supply tights on the day, we will invoice you afterwards. Tights can be purchased from Ecole.



Jazz Students

Jazz shoes should be clean and have no scuff marks. You can use shoe polish on Jazz shoes. Jazz shoes should be the slip on, elastic sided kind, from Bloch or MDM. Ecole sells Jazz shoes if you require a new pair. Please ensure your child's name is written inside their shoes. Black socks will be included with your costume.



Tap Students

Tap shoes should be polished to ensure there are no scuff marks. Tap shoes should have a buckle and should be the "Tap On" kind from Bloch. Please ensure your child's name is written inside their shoes. Tan tights will be included with your costume.



Costumes

- Costumes will be handed out at the end of the rehearsal on Saturday 26 October, as long as your Term 4 invoice has been
- All shoes should have the student's name written inside the shoe, not on the outside sole/ bottom of the shoe
- Students should wear high cut nude or white coloured underwear, that cannot be seen under their costume. You can order dance underwear from us
- Students in two dances will only take home their first costume. Ecole staff will transport their second costume to the Theatre
- If your child's two classes are in both Junior 1 and Junior 2 shows, they will only receive the costume for Junior 1. We will take the second costume to the Theatre
- Students keep their costumes. If they are in two dances, they will go home in their second costume and we will return their first costume and shoes from the first dance at their next class
- The last week of classes before the EOYP (Saturday 26 Oct to Friday 1 Nov) we will collect the shoes of the students in two dances to put with their second costume that we are transporting to the Theatre. This also applies to children in both Junior 1 and Junior 2 show
- Once you receive your child's costume, please put it away somewhere safe. Your child should not be dressing up or eating in the costume prior to the Show

Hairstyle

Students in Junior Show I wear their hair in two low pigtails. Specific instructions and images are below.

Please make sure you use a blonde elastic if you child has blonde hair. Use a brown elastic if your child has brown hair. If your child has black hair, use a black elastic. DO NOT use pink, purple etc coloured hair elastics.

Use gel and hairspray to ensure the hair is smooth and there are no fly-away hairs.

Headpieces should be secured with bobby pins the same colour as your child's hair.

Junior Students do NOT wear makeup for the Performance.
